

There have been some concerns raised about the swine flu and the possible negative effects on teams participating in our state cups. At this time we see no reason to not proceed as scheduled. In the event a team has to drop out because of numerous sick players or panic among the parents we will address that on a case-by-case basis. The LSA position is that the games are going on as scheduled and teams need to play.

This is a parental issue and parents and coaches need to be aware of their players health issues and keep them home if they are sick. If the governor or other state official issues a statewide school shut down or other decree concerning sports activities because of swine flu, we follow along. Otherwise, it is on the individual parents to monitor their children and keep them from either exposing others or being exposed.

As a proactive measure we will discontinue the handshake between players at the conclusion of all games. Instead we ask that all players simply verbally acknowledge each other with a "good-game" or other appropriate comment and refrain from any bodily contact.
